


Year 9 GCSE ART – Artists 1

Key Term	Definition
Transcription	Making a version of another artist's work in a new medium.
Cubism	An Art movement begun by Pablo Picasso and George Braque in the early 20 th Century in which different sides of an object are shown at the same time.
Pointillism	This is a method of painting scenes using tiny dabs of pure colour that appear to blend together and form different colours when looked at from a distance.
Still Life	An arrangement of a group of objects drawn or painted as a subject in their own right.
Landscape	(1) Pictures of the environment, either natural or built, form imagination or real life. (2) page layout that is wider than it is tall.
Portrait	(1) A work of Art where the main subject is a person or people. (2) Page layout that is taller than it is wide.

Key Artists	
<p>Picasso</p> <p>Pablo Picasso was a Spanish painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist and stage designer considered one of the greatest and most influential artists of the 20th century.</p>	
<p>Georgia O'Keeffe</p> <p>Georgia Totto O'Keeffe was an American artist. She was known for her paintings of enlarged flowers, New York skyscrapers, and New Mexico landscapes.</p>	
<p>Salvador Dali</p> <p>Salvador Domingo Felipe Jacinto Dalí i Domènech, 1st Marquess of Dalí of Púbol gcYC was a Spanish surrealist artist renowned for his technical skill, precise draftsmanship, and the striking and bizarre images in his work.</p>	
<p>Van Gogh</p> <p>Vincent Willem van Gogh was a Dutch post-impressionist painter who posthumously became one of the most famous and influential figures in the history of Western art.</p>

Key Term	Definition
Abstract Art	Art that is not representational or realistic, where the visual elements of art (colour, line, tone and shape) are the subject rather than a representation of a person, object or scene.
Surrealism	An Art movement of the 1920s and 1930s. Surrealists explored the unconscious mind and often painted images from dreams. They used automatic drawing techniques where doodles were turned into paintings.
Minimalism	In the late 1950s, a movement, especially in sculpture, started that aimed to reduce art objects to their bare minimum, the simplest, purest unit that could express the artists intention.
Pastiche	French for 'imitation', work made in the style of another artist.

Key Term	Definition
<p>Kandinsky</p> <p>Wassily Wassilyevich Kandinsky was a Russian painter and art theorist. Kandinsky is generally credited as the pioneer of abstract art.</p>	
<p>Frida Kahlo</p> <p>Magdalena Carmen Frida Kahlo y Calderón was a Mexican painter known for her many portraits, self-portraits, and works inspired by the nature and artifacts of Mexico.</p>	
<p>Yayoi Kusama</p> <p>Yayoi Kusama is a Japanese contemporary artist who works primarily in sculpture and installation, but is also active in painting, performance, film, fashion, poetry, fiction, and other arts.</p>	
<p>Claude Monet</p> <p>Oscar-Claude Monet was a French painter and founder of impressionist painting who is seen as a key precursor to modernism, especially in his attempts to paint nature as he perceived it.</p>
