Section A: Key vocabulary	
Vocabulary	Definition
Temporary colour	These products will last approximately one shampoo and will add tone, darken the hair or give a fashion effect.
Semi-permanent colour	Colour that lasts for 6 to 8 shampoos.
Quasi-permanent colour	Colour lasts longer, around 8 to 24 shampoos.
Permanent colour	Colour can lighten or darken hair and add tone.
Lighter	These are products which lighten the hair.
Cutting	The act or process of cutting and shaping the hair by removing length and or bulk.
Colouring	The act or process of colouring the hair by adding or changing the depth and or tone.

Section B:
Services in hairdressing
<p>Perming: Involves the use of chemicals to break some of the bonds in the hair and then reform them in a different position to produce curly hair.</p> 
<p>Relaxing: A chemical treatment where the natural curl or movement from the hair is removed or reduced, this may be temporary or permanent.</p> 
<p>Extensions: Lengths of artificial or real hair attached to a person's own hair to create a longer and or thicker hair.</p>
