NEU Strike Wednesday 1st March

Further to my previous letters, I am writing to further clarify the expectations of pupils regarding learning on **Wednesday 1st March 2023**.

As previously stated, we will be open for Year 11 students to attend school. Years 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13 and 14 will work from home. Exceptions to this are children with an EHCP and/or vulnerable students, who will be invited into school.

Please see below the guidance for all students regarding learning and home learning on Wednesday.

Year Group	What work should your child complete on Wednesday?
Years 7, 8 and 9	<p>Students should use their knowledge organisers and homework books to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Follow their school timetable and complete the relevant subject knowledge organiser. E.g. If your child has English Period 1 on Wednesday, they should start with English for roughly an hour, before moving onto their Period 2 subject.2. Task Ideas: They could complete flashcards, homework tasks from the KO, or other 'How to self-quiz' tasks from the help page in the front of their KO.3. Year 7 students: Students have a Key Assessment Point the week beginning 6th February, and so can also prepare for these using the KOs and/or any further resources provided by class teachers. <p>All student knowledge organisers can be found here: https://www.leesbrook.co.uk/learning/knowledge-organisers/</p> <p>Oak National Academy has lessons which students can use to support their knowledge organiser homework: https://classroom.thenational.academy/subjects-by-key-stage/key-stage-3</p>

Year 10	<p>Students should use their knowledge organisers and homework books to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Follow their school timetable and complete the relevant subject knowledge organiser. E.g. If your child has English Period 1 on Wednesday, they should start with English for roughly an hour, before moving onto their Period 2 subject. 2. Task Ideas: They could complete flashcards, homework tasks from the KO, or other 'How to self-quiz' tasks from the help page in the front of their KO. <p>Students can also revise for their lessons and revisit topics they have covered within their normal lessons. Year 11	The academy is open to Year 11 students.
Years 12, 13 and 14	Sixth Form teachers will set work on Tuesday for the students to complete on the Wednesday.
